Pick Elementary School has a highly qualified faculty. The teachers use research-based curriculum and instruction and participate in on-going professional development. The state of Alabama has recently adopted Alabama College and Career Ready Standards. Teachers at Pick have also participated in the <u>Alabama Reading Initiative</u>(ARI). Teachers use sound, research-based instructional practices to teach reading. We use the McGraw-Hill textbook WONDERS as one guide, but this is not the only resource we use to teach reading. Many teachers use inquiry-based methods to teach Math and Science. We use Alabama and Career Ready Standards to teach Math and Science as well. As a school system, we have adopted the series <u>Go Math!</u> Kindergarten-5. Changes in state and national assessments call for more rigor and relevance to your child's reading, math and science programs; therefore, students are required to not only answer questions but provide written proof as to how they arrived at their answer. We use the STEMscopes curriculum K-5 as a resource for Science, but we use science note booking, hands-on kits and project-based learning to teach Math, Science and Social Studies. Pick Elementary ensures students have a safe and orderly school environment, as well as a warm and friendly school climate.

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

Pick Elementary School will provide parent conference opportunities and information sessions at the beginning of the year, on Curriculum Night in August, and on Parent Teacher Conference Day. Parents and teachers may request additional conferences throughout the year.
